

Uniform Policy

Our school Vision: Building Empowered Learners for Life
Our 3 Universals: We are Respectful - We are Safe - We are Learners

The wearing of a school uniform:

- Promotes pride in our school
- Enhances our public image
- Reduces peer pressure
- Encourages appropriate clothing for school activities that promotes safety and protection
- Makes students easily identifiable in the yard/on excursions or when representing the school
- Promotes a sense of equality and inclusiveness and belonging.

It is an expectation at Christies Beach Primary School that all children will wear a school uniform. Clothing with non-school logos (e.g. Nike Adidas) is not acceptable.

The governing Council has approved the Uniform Policy and expects compliance of students, parents and staff.

Compliance Obligations

Any student not wearing full school uniform who:

- (a) Has a note of explanation from home, will be provided with a loan uniform.
- (b) Does not have a note of explanation from home, will be provided with a loan uniform and parents/caregivers will be contacted by letter, diary note or phone if the student persistently breaches the school dress code.

In keeping with the schools principles of social justice, a member of the leadership team may arrange for uniform items to be made available to families in extenuating circumstances. Parents or staff should contact a leadership member to discuss the situation.

Christies Beach Primary School Uniform

Polo Shirt: Green with gold logo and CBPS on collar or bottle green polo.

Dress: Green and white checkered dress (optional)

Bottoms: Grey or bottle green pants, shorts and skorts that are free from all logos. Shorts must be mid-thigh length.

Windcheater: Bottle green zip up windcheater, school windcheater or school brush fleece windcheater with gold logo.

Jacket: Bottle green school jacket or microfiber jacket with gold logo.

Hats: In line with the Department For Education Sun Protection Policy all our students are required to wear a green broad brimmed, legionnaire or bucket hat in Terms 1 and 4, and from September 1st in Term 3.

Footwear: Comfortable shoes should be worn that allow safe participation in all activities including PE. Inappropriate shoes include ballet flats, thongs, slip-ons, wheeled and heeled shoes. Socks should be black, white or grey.

The year 7 jumper is designed every year and available through a special order.

Clothing which is unacceptable for safety reasons:

- Midriff tops and tank tops
- Ripped clothing (patches acceptable)
- Mini skirts and brief shorts (acceptable shorts should reach mid-thigh)
- Thongs or slippers.
- Makeup and nail polish
- Necklaces (unless for religious/special reasons after negotiation with Principal) and chokers
- Bracelets, wrist bands, anklets and rings
- Earrings – studs and sleepers are acceptable No stretchers, nose or eyebrow rings
- Peaked Caps or beanies (unless the child has an ear infection & there is a parent/caregiver note)
- Denim jeans and shorts

Please note: Children can wear a coat/jacket of their colour choice to and from school. At school, or during excursions school colours must be worn.

Donations of good quality second hand uniforms are welcome. A limited supply of second hand uniforms will be available for sale.

The lost property box is located out the front of the office. Please clearly label all items of clothing so they can be returned if lost.
