In consultation with our ATSI community it has been decided that we will refurbish the Science Room with mini kitchen facilities also being included in the alcove area outside this room. Landscaping will also be undertaken in the space where the current ECO Room stands. Initial plans are to create a cultural gathering space with tiered seating and indigenous symbols representing past and present ATSI families as well as indigenous plantings for this area. We are aiming to hold a grand opening of these new areas as part of our 60th Birthday Celebrations which will be held on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> August, 2021.

- Don't seal envelopes inside each other. You can pay for all children in one envelope however each child needs to have their own envelope on photo day
- Family envelopes are available at the school office and need to be ordered before or on photography day. Please make sure your children are aware they are having a family photo and present the family envelope to the photographer on the day.
- Please enclose correct money as no change is given. Cash, cheques, credit card and money orders also accepted.

Parents can send the money to the school on the day in the self-sealed envelope supplied however **On-Line Ordering**, where parents are now able to select their preferred package online makes it much easier for our parent community.

Placing your child's order online is the safest & easiest way to order school photos. Just enter the shootkey printed on your child's envelope and make your selection! If you are having a Sibling photo taken, do the same with the shootkey printed on that envelope (envelopes available from schools front office) and you're done. It really is that easy!

The range of options available to you online has increased. As well as the option to download a Low Resolution image for a smart-phone, parents will now have the option to purchase a High Resolution Digital Download of their child.

An added incentive for our families is that MSP now offers a 10% discount for all orders above \$90.00 a family. To receive this discount online your orders must be placed in one transaction. Finally, ducks lay eggs. Duck eggs are good for eating and cooking. You can cook cakes with duck eggs. Duck eggs are big and yummy.


Forget cats, horses, dogs and guinea pigs. Get yourself a duck because you will love it. You can sell the duck eggs and get rich.

At Christies Beach Primary School, we continually encourage and foster a love for reading. In Terms 2 & 3 we will be introducing different reading comprehension strategies to the school community to support students to read for meaning. Every few weeks we will introduce a new strategy and different activities that you can do at home to support students with their reading. Our first two strategies are predicting and visualising.

## PREDICTING

Using clues from the text, pictures and speech to help work out what might happen next

#### **ACTIVITIES**

- Hide text and show only illustrations, diagrams and pictures.
   Children predict and create their own text to match the illustrations.
- Predictions about events in the story are made by children before reading the text. Children then check their predictions after reading.
- Children look at cover of book and make predictions about what words are going to be in the text and explain why.

#### **CHALLENGE:**

Can you predict what happened before and after this photo was taken? Why have you made these predictions?



#### **ACTIVITIES**

- Read a section of a text without showing any pictures and children draw a visual representation of their interpretation of character/setting/event from that piece of text.
- Children are asked to create character portraits and include key words to describe the character's thoughts and feelings.

#### **CHALLENGE:**

Can you draw a visual representation of the text below?
