Dear Parents, Caregivers and Community Members,

What an amazing first term we have had. This term our students have had the opportunity to participate in many different learning experiences. Some of these have included a Westpac Rescue Helicopter visit, a visit to Parliament House and visits by a First Nations author.

This year, one of our school improvement goals is for all students to demonstrate individual growth in their reading. One of our whole school strategies to help students' reading is by focussing on students' oral reading fluency. All classes are explicitly teaching oral reading and encouraging reading practise each day for at least 15 minutes.

As a family, it is also important for you to read with your child each day. Students will bring home a reader and a library book each week. Please listen to your child read each day and also read to them. It is important for students to develop their oral reading fluency through repeated reading in order to increase their reading rate. This will mean that students will not swap their reader over each day.

There will also be a whole school focus on the purpose and use of our Library and public libraries to improve access to reading materials for students. Think about a visit to our local Noarlunga Library in the holidays. Finally, we as adults need to model reading and talk about the importance of reading with our children so that they can recognise the purpose or reading. When we read we have access to a whole other world.

The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you'll go." -- Dr. Seuss.

Thank you for all of your support this term. We appreciate all of the extra ways that families help out in our school community.










PARENT WORKSHOP
